Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

- 1. The Carers' Group has been up to capacity all year and there is currently a waiting list.
- 2. There has been a wide range of activities offered to the families living with dementia.
- 3. The charity has worked with others in the Dunbar area to build up a network of support for those living with dementia.
- The charity has received good support from across the community, indicating that there is both an awareness of the charity's existence and of the needs of those living with dementia.
- 5. The charity now has a salaried Group Co-ordinator which has given the group a level of security and confidence.
- 6. The charity reaches out through its web presence.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The general reserve at 31st March 2019 amounted to £11,434.99 The trustees hold this level of reserves to cover the anticipated expenditure over the coming year as it is important to those living with dementia to know that the charity has a positive future.

There was also a restricted fund of £309.91 which is the Social Fund of the members of the Dunbar Dementia Carers Group which is held for the members for their social events. This fund is not available for the general working of the charity.

Donated facilities and services (if any)

East Lothian Council allowed the charity to use its facilities at Bleachingfield for its weekly meetings free of charge.
